The Church's Liturgical Year: Designed to Make The 'Good News' of Christ Real & Contemporary to Believers

Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people. — Luke 2:10

The angelic choir announced the 'good news' to Jewish Shepherd who hurried to see the newborn Christ.

When they saw the star, they rejoiced exceedingly with great joy; and going into the house they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they fell down and worshipped him. Then, opening their treasures, they offered him gifts, gold and frankincense and myrrh. — Matthew 2:10-11

A supernatural great light announced the 'good news' to the *Gentile* Magi. Both announcements come alive in the Church's liturgical year: Christmas and the 12th day *after* Christmas, January 6th, known as Epiphany or the 3 King's Day.

Webster's Dictionary defines *epiphany* as "a sudden, intuitive perception of or insight into reality." The Babe of Bethlehem brings this and more for *all peoples*. Jews and Gentile alike can receive God's greatest gift, His Son Jesus Christ, and reflect the glory of God the Father.



Twelve days *after* Christmas, Epiphany or the 3 Kings Day is typically observed by Orthodox, Catholic, and Anglican Christians. We sing of "The Twelve Days of Christmas," but most Protestants don't know it refers to one of earliest celebrations of the Christian church. In some cultures, Christmas gifts are given for each of the Twelve Days; in others, the 3 Kings are honored and bring gifts to children at Epiphany rather than Christmas.

The earliest reference to Epiphany as a Christian feast was in 361 AD, by Ammianus Marcellinus, a fourth-century Roman soldier and historian. It's been the occasion for Popes and Saints to preach the Good News of the Love of God *for Gentiles*. For Epiphany worship services, Johann Sebastian Bach composed two cantatas; and carols such as "We Three Kings" were written.

According to ancient custom, the priests in Western Churches announced the date of Easter on the feast of Epiphany. Calendars were not readily available, and the Church needed to publicize the date of Easter, since many celebrations of the liturgical year depend on it. Epiphany is followed by celebration of Jesus' Baptism and His first miracle at Cana, turning water into wine.

Today in Eastern Orthodox churches, there is less emphasis on the role of the Magi and more on the *shining forth and revelation of Jesus Christ* as the Messiah and Second Person of the Trinity and on Christ's baptism. Epiphany is the occasion for the blessing of waters, sailing fleets and houses.

AN ACTIVITY FOR SMALL GROUPS and families with children

YOU WILL NEED: • A Bible • Pens (sets of 2-3 different colors) • A map of the world.

READ: Psalm 72 out loud.

DISCUSS: Share your reflections on Psalm 72. (Parents: Explain what the passage means in terms your children will understand.)

READ OUT LOUD: Think about the identity of the Savior. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." The Savior then gave us our identity, saying, "You are the light of the world," and calling us to make known His light [His *Good News*] to the whole world.

ACTIVITY: 1. Attach the map to the bulletin board or hang it in a prominent place where your group gathers or in your home.

2. Throughout the week, as you watch TV, use the Internet, read or hear the news, note places and countries where there is *darkness* - where people are hurting, oppressed, in need or in danger. Then, note places and countries where you hear stories of *good news* - where Christ's light is shining.

3. When your group gathers (or once a week as a family) use one color pen to mark places of *darkness* (Psalm 72:12-14.) Pray that God's light, deliverance, justice, and righteousness would be known in these places. Use another color to mark where you have heard stories of *God's doing marvelous deeds* (Psalm 72:18-19). Spend time praising God for His glorious works.

4. Continue the activity for several gatherings. Share what you've learned about 'Good News' for ALL People — Jews and Gentiles.

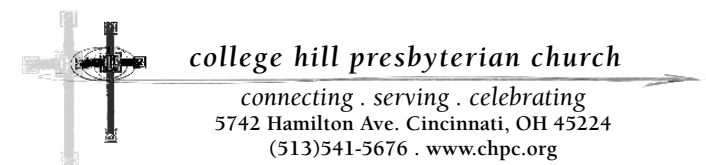
Available Help
