New Children, Youth & Family Welcome Desk!

If you glance down the Main Street hallway this morning, you'll notice there's now a desk hanging out in the Barnabas Center Lobby. This is our brand new Children, Youth & Family (CYF) Welcome Desk! Parents of families who are part of our church community will staff the desk each Sunday. This will help them get to know the kids of other families involved in our church, as well as provide an easy way for them to welcome and connect with new families who visit. In addition, the CYF Welcome Desk will provide a safer and more secure environment for kids and youth in the Barnabas Center, as it will serve as the check-in point for all children and youth attending classes on Sunday mornings.



CHPC has new church management software called LOGOS, and we will now be using the check-in program that integrates with this software. The new check-in system will provide the same safety benefits as the old system, but will also be used to track attendance for all children/youth classes and events. Any individual or family who regularly attends CHPC or who has entered their children into the old check-in system will find their information already listed in the new system.



Here are a few things to know if you are part of a family with children or youth:

- On Sunday mornings, **all children and youth (birth-12th grade) will now check in** at the CYF Welcome Desk for Sunday school classes, nursery, and Children & Worship. This is a change from the old system where only children checked in.
- Children and youth will check in using this system at events like MEGABLAST, CRASH, and Huddles
- **Teachers and leaders for children and youth will also check in.**

Even if you don't have kids, here's how you can help:

- Pray that the CYF Welcome Desk will provide a clear and helpful point of connection for new families on Sunday mornings
- If you see children or youth wandering around the church without a name tag on Sunday mornings, please direct them to the Barnabas Lobby to check in!

1st & 2nd SUNDAYS of LENT

Activity for Small Groups & families with children

Lent is the 40 days prior to Easter that the Church focuses on learning about the life of Jesus Christ and preparing for Holy Week.



YOU WILL NEED: 7 candles and candle holders and a map of Israel.

WHAT TO DO: Begin by lighting all 7 candles. Week 1, darken one. Week 2, darken one more, etc. Recite the meaning of each candle as it is extinguished. Listed in chronological order, each candle identifies: (a) A PLACE in Jesus' life; (2) A KEY EVENT in His life; and (3) A 'BETRAYAL' He experienced in connection with that event.

SAY: **This week we darken the 7th candle: EGYPT — Peril.** After Christ's birth in Bethlehem, the first step on His journey was to **flee to Egypt to escape death** at the hands of King Herod. **And, we darken the 6th candle: NAZARETH — Baptism.** Jesus was baptized and went out to be tempted in the wilderness for 40 days. He returned to His home, **Nazareth**, and was **rejected by His own people**. Read Luke 4:1-30 out loud.

DISCUSS: Share your reflections on the text. Parents explain what the passage means in terms children understand. What is baptism? Why was Jesus tempted? What kind of temptation was it? Who tempted him? Why was Jesus rejected by people who knew him?

ACTIVITY: Find Nazareth and the Jordan River on the map. Draw a picture or find one of Jesus being baptized. If you were doing a movie what would Jesus being tempted look like to you? What 'tempts' you? Is that something God wants permission to change? Ever been rejected? By whom?

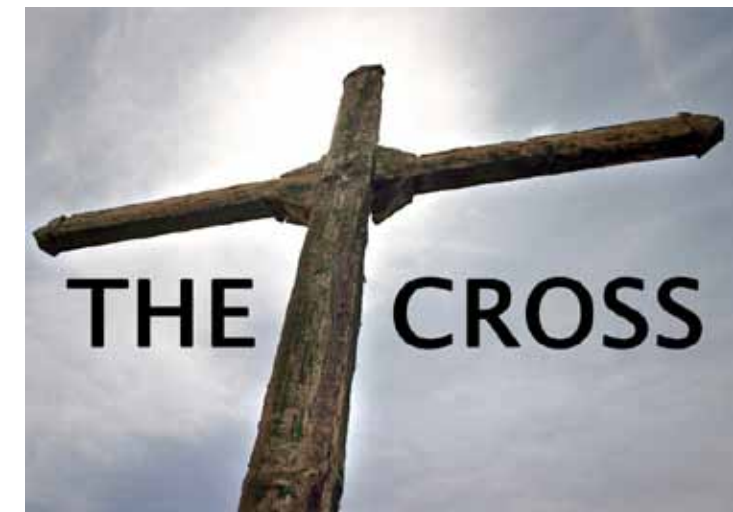
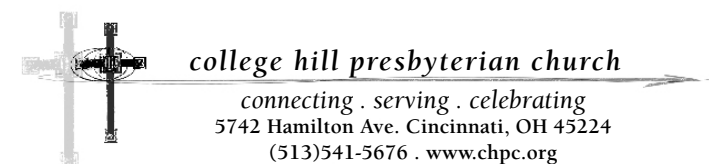
