Do we as a church believe that God's Word has authority over this world? Do you as a follower of Jesus believe you have authority over this world through the Word of God?

As a church we overwhelmingly voted to move to a new denomination because of this central issue. Throughout Scripture we read about the miraculous signs and wonders Jesus did throughout His ministry. Some think these were done only to prove Jesus was God - but Jesus taught his disciples to do the same signs and wonders. Jesus tells his followers to "Heal the sick, raise the dead, cleanse those who have leprosy" in Matthew 10:8. And Jesus said that we who come after Him will do even greater works than he did.

What's Happening With Feast of Love?

Karen Lane had a vision and she plugged and prodded to make that vision a reality, and now I believe God is asking us to expand that vision. I am not exactly sure how that looks, but I do know God is doing incredible things through Feast of Love.

In our *Find a Need and Fill It* ministry, we gave away over 200 beds to families and individuals last year. Many of those beds went to homeless veterans, who, through the help of an agency found homes. Many more families now have furniture for their homes. I was humbled by a mom who was able to get out of an abusive relationship and get her own home. She came to the warehouse and Feast of Love was able to let her "go shopping" for the needs of her family. I watched as she "built her home" with donations. She was overjoyed to have a chance to start over.

Camp S'more continues to be a ministry that blesses the socks off the children and staff. Each letter the children wrote mentioned the food and ice cream we served. I have to admit our cooks are the best around. Last week I heard from a teacher, who had a former student who is in college, come back for a visit and he still remembers Camp S'more! He said it was the best trip of his life! Camp is life changing for many of these children.

Tools for Schools served 28 area schools with supplies. That translates into approximately 10,000 children. These numbers are mind-boggling to me. This year we hope to add to the number of schools we can serve.

We served 2460 people this past year during our *Holiday Dinners*. Our volunteers numbered well over 200! Many of these volunteers come back every year. Amazing! This year during our Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners we changed things up a bit. We served each person buffet style. That way each person was greeted with a smile! It was incredible to witness the smiles that were returned. I had a lot of people say how much they enjoyed the change. We plan to continue this with our Easter Brunch as well.

Operation Baby Formula and Diapers has been dormant the majority of the year. This ministry will begin again soon with Feast of Love supporting another ministry called "Safe Families".

FOUNDERS AND FAMOUS FAMILIES OF CINCINNATI

Another great speaker is planned for Supper Club on Monday evening, February 23 in Fellowship Hall. Wendy Hart Beckman is an award-winning freelance writer and editor. Her eight books to date have all been nonfiction, but she is currently pitching one novel and finishing another. Her 300 plus articles have been published in such markets as Writers' Digest, Cincinnati Magazine, and M.D. News Magazine.

As much a history as it is a tribute to the Queen City, her book, Founders and Famous Families of Cincinnati gathers and shares the stories of local folks who are as familiar to people around the globe as they are to Cincinnatians: Procter, Gamble, Taft, Longworth, Lindner, plus 150 others. Even as new faces and new names join them, many of our famous families of the past will continue to be our foundational families of the future. This book tops off the city's familial histories by noting the innovations that have affected the rest of the world: the first professional baseball team, the first pharmacy college, the first Jewish hospital, the first municipal university, the first concrete skyscraper, the first municipal railroad, and so many more.

Wendy's bachelor's degrees are in geology and natural science/technical communications. She has a master's degree in English with a concentration in editing and publishing and a graduate certificate in professional writing. She tutors high school students in reading, writing, science and English. For adult writers who wish to get published, she holds several workshops each year. After her talk, Wendy will be signing copies of her book (\$20.00, including tax).
