

Adult Spiritual Formation Update

We have an exciting lineup of classes for March and April! The new series of classes, listed below, begins in March and runs for six weeks, right up until Palm Sunday and Easter. Several of the classes will continue for another five weeks after Easter into the next term: these are noted below in the course descriptions.

SP11: 24/6 Reclaiming the Sabbath

“Remember the Sabbath and keep it holy.” How do we find rest in a 24/7 world? Setting aside a day of rest helps us reconnect with our Creator and find the peace of God that passes all understanding. Come to this study, based on Matthew Sleeth’s 24/6: A Prescription for a Healthier, Happier Life, to learn how to live a God-centered life in a digitally-dazed, always-on world. Participants will need to obtain a copy of the book (available in both print and digital format) for the class. Led by Jim Warner at 10:10 a.m. Class size limited to 15.

SP12: Rumors of Another World

What on earth are we missing? Are we missing the supernatural hidden in everyday life? Come to this study, based on Philip Yancey’s Rumors of Another World, to discover how faith helps us make sense of our world and understand our role in it. Participants will need to obtain a copy of the book (available in both print and digital format) for the class. Led by Zach Vander Veen at 10:10 a.m. Class size limited to 15.

SP24: Cat and Dog Theology

By examining how cats and dogs relate to their masters, this class challenges Christians to see how we tend to use God mainly for getting what we want. Come learn what it means to live for God rather than expecting God to live for us. Led by Chappie and Marybelle Chapman at 10:10 a.m. Class size limited to 15.

FA21: For Men Only/For Women Only

Whether married or single, this study offers eye-opening insights and practical tips for understanding the opposite sex. Join us to learn the many wonderful ways God created man and woman. This class is a continuation of the course of the same name currently in progress. Led by Jeanne Schneider at 10:10 a.m. Class size limited to 15.

BT10: Ten Commandments and Nine Suggestions

How does the Old Testament law help us today? Was it not nailed to the cross? This is a study of the Exodus 20 and Deuteronomy 5 along with other relevant Old Testament laws with suggestions for how they are relevant today. Led by William Custer at 9:00 a.m. Class size limited to 15.

BT11: Who Is Jesus?

For over 2,000 years, people everywhere have continued to grapple with the all important question, “Who is Jesus?” Discover the truth about Jesus for yourselves by exploring Jesus’s ancestry and prophetic mission; His words, works, and character; His death and resurrection; whether Jesus is the only way to God; and more. Led by Cathy Lowe and Cindy Brown at 10:10 a.m. Class size limited to 15. *This class will continue after Easter into the next term.*

BT11: The “I Am” Sayings of Jesus

In this video series, Dr. R.C. Sproul examines John’s record of the eight unique “I AM” sayings of Jesus, all of which are powerful expressions of His saving relationship to His people, and uses God’s Word to bring us to a deeper understanding of the God-man as both protector and nurturer of His people. Participants will need to obtain a copy of the accompanying study guide (available in paperback) for the class. Led by Fran Kelley at 10:10 a.m. Class size limited to 15. *This class will continue after Easter into the next term.*

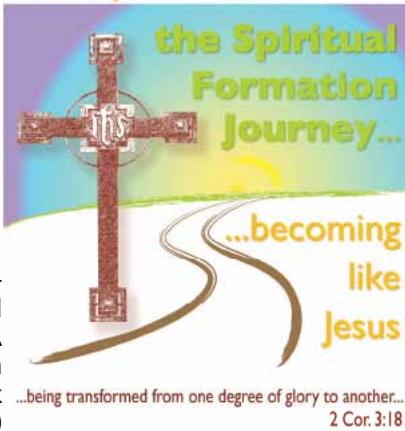
BT15: Galatians

SUPPER CLUB IS BACK

Supper Club is back under full speed this month after a two month vacation. We’ll meet in Fellowship Hall on February 24, at 6:15pm, with a gourmet meal, fellowship and a speaker. Make your reservations by calling Sally Auble at 741-3125 before Thursday, February 20.

Our speaker will be Dr. Richard Doyle, a retired chemistry professor from Denison University, now living at Llanfair, who has been interested in mushrooms for over 40 years. He is a member of the Ohio Mushroom Society and the North American Mycological Association. In his talk, he will tell us about foraging for edible mushrooms both in the grocery store and in the woods.

“What is so exciting about mushrooms?” you may ask. Did you know that there are approximately 14,000 species of mushrooms? A mushroom may be edible, poisonous, or just plain yucky. There are puff-ball mushrooms, oyster mushrooms, paddy-straw and shaggy-mane mushrooms, as well as lobster mushrooms, jelly fungi and tooth fungi. Psychedelic or “magic mushrooms” (or “shrooms,”) have been known to facilitate mystical experiences in native medicine traditions in cultures all around the world. And what’s a toadstool, anyhow?

So come and hear about these exotic little plants that bring about memories of fairy-rings, gnomes and magic potions . . . and you may get a chance to taste some. That’s Monday, February 24. Cost is \$10.00 at the door.
