This letter was written by a birth mom to the Host Family (Matt and Julie Wilbur) and the Family Coach (Heather Ingle). The birth mom two girl's, Addison (age 4) and Aleeyah (age 3), lived with the Wilbur family for 2 weeks.

When I met Matt and Julie I felt loved. Matt was so nurturing to my emotional breakdown and they welcomed me to come see my girls anytime (which surprised me because I know I looked like a crying snot face lunatic). When they left with my babies it was really hard at first because I still didn't know Matt and Julie but I stayed close by moving house-to-house (even Heather's house) but never going far. I checked on them every day. Then I found a shelter an hour away but I wasn't scared or nervous because my kids loved these once strangers and they loved us. Julie became the mother figure I craved for so long and Matt was like the dad that sorta stood back and watched me bump my head but was always there to rub the scar.



I realized I created this family that wasn't tied by blood or obligation but because they wanted to be there for me. It wasn't like they helped and then just gave them back and sent me to fend for myself. They came anytime I called they even called me and asked to have my girls for a weekend. I AM NO LONGER ALONE. I NO LONGER HAVE TO CRAVE A SAFE HAVEN FOR MY KIDS BECAUSE I HAVE MATT AND JULIE AND HEATHER!

This is my story but it's not my ending because what seemed as a uniform program became the family we needed. I'm not saying it's easy but it's worth it and I can promise mother-to-mother even if it's a one-time thing your kids will be loved. I don't care how messed up you think you are, Safe Families will accept you and help you. The fear you feel is normal, but that break you will get will not only help you, but your kids will also be helped by giving you the time every mother needs. Raising kids doesn't come with instructions and it's not easy and it is ok to take time for you and for them.

2nd SUNDAY of LENT

Activity for Small Groups & families with children



Lent is the 40 days prior to Easter that the Church focuses on teaching about the life of Jesus Christ and preparing for Holy Week.

YOU WILL NEED: 7 candles and candle holders and a map of Israel.

WHAT TO DO: Begin by lighting all 7 candles. Week 1, darken one. Week 2, darken one more, etc. Recite the meaning of each candle as it is extinguished. Listed in chronological order, each candle identifies: (a) A PLACE in Jesus' life; (2) A KEY EVENT in His life; and (3) A 'BETRAYAL' He experienced in connection with that event.

SAY: **This week we darken the 7th candle: EGYPT — Peril.** After Christ's birth in Bethlehem, the first step on His journey was to flee to Egypt to escape death at the hands of King Herod. **And, we darken the 6th candle: NAZARETH — Baptism.** Jesus was baptized and tempted in the wilderness for 40 days. He returned to His home, Nazareth, and was rejected by His own people. Read Luke 4:1-30 out loud.

DISCUSS: Share your reflections on the text. Parents explain what the passage means in terms your children understand. What is baptism? Why was Jesus tempted? Who tempted him? Why was Jesus rejected by people who knew him?

ACTIVITY: Locate Nazareth and the Jordan River on the map. Draw a picture or find one of Jesus being baptized. If you were doing a movie what would Jesus being rejected by his own people look like to you?

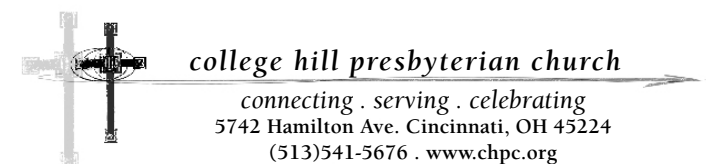
