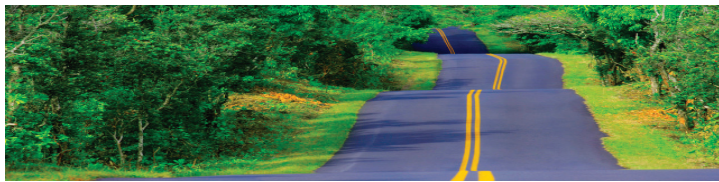

Upcoming Session Guest Speakers

While we wait for the Discernment Team's recommendation, Session is studying our options for the end of this process. Those options are to stay in the PCUSA and affiliate with the Fellowship of Presbyterians or leave the denomination. If we choose to leave, the two most likely choices are the Evangelical Covenant Order of Presbyterians (ECO) or the Evangelical Presbyterian Church (EPC).

It is very important that we understand the differences between all of the options. Written information will be disseminated to you in the future about these choices. Your Session has invited local representatives of all our options to share their experiences and discuss their reasons for the path they have chosen.

Although Session is leading the congregation in this decision, we want to be sure that the congregation also has an opportunity to learn about our choices. Anyone in the congregation who wishes to understand these options is invited to attend the three upcoming Session meetings in March.

All Session Meetings are held in Barnabas rooms 201 & 202. Our guest speakers will be presenting to Session and will be engaging in dialogue with the Session members. If you choose to attend, please understand that your role is one of observer and you will not be able to actively participate in the discussion.
