## The Church's Liturgical Year: Lent - A little leaven...

Lent was never intended to be 'thing-centered' (giving up facebook, sweets, beer, meat, watching sports, etc). It is to be 'Christ-centered.' We're to REST and make space and quiet in our noisy world to meet Christ and for Him to refocus us on God's Glory. The 40 days of Lent provide time to reflect on the Love Story of God the Father, Jesus Christ's passionate sacrifice for the sin of the whole World, and our being *leaven* wherever we are.

### LENT & PASSOVER

• The Passion and Death of Christ was accomplished just before Passover. God's plagues on the Egyptians didn't show up in my Sunday School lessons, so as a new believer, I didn't know much about Passover...or so I thought.

From the 2nd to the 6th grade, I lived in a conservative Jewish neighborhood in a two-story house. The Bilskis lived upstairs and they celebrated holidays I didn't even know existed. Passover was one.

The Passover dinner or Seder is an interactive drama that question by question enables the family to remember and relive the revelation of God's power and glory in the Exodus account, and His blessing of His chosen people. It was so important a meal that it had its own order of celebration, the Haggadah. The Bilski children went to Hebrew schul after regular school so they could read *their* Bible and works like the Haggadah.

At the Passover, the *youngest* child was designated to ask, "Why is this night different from all other nights?" It was followed by another question: "Why is it that on all other nights during the year we eat either leavened bread or matzah, but on this night we eat only matzah (or unleavened bread)? The answer was given: "We eat only matzah because our ancestors could not wait for their breads to rise when they were fleeing slavery in Egypt, and so they were flat when they came out of the oven." Then Matzah was eaten by all.

Some pieces of Matzah were 'hidden' in a special pouch and reserved for later. Four more questions, stories and songs followed. As a child, I was captivated by this new and strange 'supper.' It would be nearly 20 years before I would begin to understand this experience in the context of holy communion.

### LENT & LEAVEN

• Gal. 5:9 — *A little leaven leavens the whole lump.* Mrs Bilski had a starring role in the Seder. She also had a special 'prop.' My German Grandmother Flora, the housecleaning addict, was a loafer compared to Mrs Bilski doing 'Spring cleaning'

before the Seder. Everything that could be moved was; anything that could be beaten, washed or dry cleaned was. Her separate Kosher kitchen dishes were scrubbed even if they looked clean.

She cooked the Passover lamb and all the special foods with great care, referring to her Haggada. But, just before the Seder was served, she appeared with a large leather envelope that contained a feather. While everyone watched, she symbolically dusted corners of the room with the feather so there was no leaven hiding anywhere. Then the meal proceeded.

I asked, "So what's the fuss about a little leaven?" Later I was told, "It's what God prescribed, to tell His story *aright*." I now understand that Lent is a time of letting God 'get the leaven out' of believers by intentionally yielding to His *Spring cleaning so that we can reveal His Glory and tell His story aright*.

I Cor 5:6 says, "Don't you know that a little yeast leavens the whole

batch of dough? Get rid of the old yeast, so that you may be a new unleavened batch — as you really are. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. Therefore let us keep the Festival, not with the old bread leavened with malice and wickedness, but with the unleavened bread of sincerity and truth.

### LENTEN ACTIVITY for SMALL GROUPS & FAMILIES

YOU WILL NEED: 7 candles and candle holders. Map of Israel.

WHAT YOU DO: Light all candles. Week 1, darken one. Week 2, darken one more, etc. Recite the meaning of each candle as it is extinguished. Each is a Jesus place, an event and a betrayal.

MEANING: **7th candle: Egypt (Peril).** **6th: Nazareth (Rejection).** **5th: GALILEE — Discipling. Jesus attracted many but chose 12. Four from Galilee were his first disciples — All 12 would cause him disappointments and trials.**

DISCUSS: Share your reflections about the text. Parents explain what the passage means in terms your children will understand. Even Jesus experienced disappointments in life.

ACTIVITY: Locate Bethlehem, Egypt, Nazareth and Galilee on the map. Go to [www.bibleinfo.com/en/questions/who-were-twelve-disciples](http://www.bibleinfo.com/en/questions/who-were-twelve-disciples) and read about the 12. Talk about your favorite disciple and why. Did that disciple disappoint Jesus?



## Let's bless the city together!

Last year 30 churches got very practical about serving the poor in our city. They went on a beans and rice diet for one week. Then they took the difference in their food budget that week and gave an astounding \$578,000 collectively toward organizations making a difference in our communities. The feedback was amazing, and the churches were transformed. Last year, CHPC was able to give \$3,063 (\$1021 each) to Christ's Community in College Hill, Pleasant Hill Academy's Summer Camp and CityLink Center.

We will take up a special offering on March 22nd, and the money donated will be given to various ministries around Greater Cincinnati. We know an entire week of rice and beans is not feasible for everyone, or probably desirable for anyone. Our hope is that everyone will participate in some way. If you can't do it for the whole week, do it for a day or one meal. The hope is that we are able to grow closer to one another as a church, and to identify with other believers in the church around Cincinnati and Northern Kentucky, by sacrificing a bit of ourselves for the sake of others. We also pray that through this small sacrifice, we would better remember the greatest sacrifice of all shown to us by Jesus.
