

## STEPHEN FOSTER AT SUPPER CLUB

Would you like to spend an evening with Stephen Foster? Then come to Fellowship Hall Monday evening, April 28. A delicious catered dinner will be served at 6:15 and the program will begin at 7:00. Call Sally Auble by Thursday, April 24, at 741-3125 to make your reservations. The cost is \$10.

Mr. Ashley Ford, of the Cincinnati History Museum at Cincinnati Museum Center, will share Stephen Foster's music and life story with us. There will be a chance for us to join together and sing some of Stephen Foster's songs.

Stephen Foster (1826 – 1864), known as the "father of American music," wrote over 200 songs. Among his best known are "Oh! Susanna," "Old Folks at Home", "Camptown Races," "My Old Kentucky Home," "Jeanie with the Light Brown Hair," "Beautiful Dreamer" and numerous others.

Born in Pennsylvania, Foster moved to Cincinnati in 1846 and became a bookkeeper with his brother's steamship company. While in Cincinnati, he penned his first successful songs - among them "Oh! Susanna," which became an anthem of the California Gold Rush in 1848-1849.

Many of his songs had Southern themes, yet Foster never lived in the South and visited it only once. On his honeymoon in 1852, he and his bride took a river-boat voyage down the Mississippi to New Orleans. Stephen Foster moved his family to New York City in 1860 and about a year later, his wife and daughter left him. Beginning in 1862, his fortunes decreased. He died in New York City hotel on the lower east side of Manhattan. His worn leather wallet contained a scrap of paper that simply said, "Dear friends and gentle hearts," along with 38 cents in Civil War scrip and three pennies. One of his most beloved works, "Beautiful Dreamer," was published shortly after his death.
