CHPC World Mission Team

Missionary Preparation Program

The World Mission Team of CHPC is developing a Missionary Preparation Program to encourage and assist members and friends of CHPC who are considering becoming long term overseas mission workers. CHPC has supported financially and by prayer many missionaries over the past several decades. Some of these workers have recently retired or are near retirement. Currently, we see few young people seriously considering a life of service in this area. The purpose of this Program is to provide an avenue to support a new generation of global workers.

Missions Resource and Mentor List

The World Mission Team will prepare a resource list of members and friends of CHPC who have traveled overseas as either short term or long term mission workers. Everyone who has been overseas for a short term project such as a SonLight Power trip or a trip sponsored by any other Christian or charitable organization will be encouraged to fill out a resource sheet. Long term or career mission workers sponsored by any group will also be critical resources for potential new workers.

People agreeing to be on the list would be asked to share their experiences one on one with interested parties, and perhaps become a mentor. Another possibility would be to make a presentation at a World Mission Team meeting to which all people interested in mission work in a specific country or part of the world would be invited to attend. A sign-up form for the Resource List is available at the front desk in the atrium and on the church website under "Forms" and "Missions."

Missions Seed Money Fund

Although some long term mission workers are able to provide much of their own financial support by working overseas, this is not possible for short term workers or for most new long term workers. To help with this financial need and to demonstrate the sincere commitment of CHPC to overseas mission work, the World Mission Team has established a Missions Seed Money Fund.

For adults (18 years of age or older and high school graduates) who are part of the CHPC family, the World Mission Team will provide typically \$100 per person per year toward the cost of going on an approved overseas mission trip. The trip may be either short term or long term.

To apply for funds, the potential overseas worker will be required to fill out a short application including a description of the trip and its purpose, their specific role, the name of the sponsoring organization, the total cost and other sources of funding. The applicant will also be required to meet with members of the World Mission Team to discuss their application. The application is available at the front desk and on the church website.

Educational Programs

Educational programs have been and will continue to be held during the Sunday morning Foundation Hour and at Sunday afternoon World Mission Team meetings. Current or retired overseas mission workers will discuss topics that will provide vital information to potential new workers. It is critical that potential new workers have a complete and accurate picture of the realities of overseas work. At the same time, they must be shown that the World Mission Team at CHPC is committed to long term relationships with our mission workers, and will support them in a variety of ways.

Congregational Dessert and Discussion

If you could not make the SWEET discussion on Monday night, we missed you but wanted everyone to know what we talked about. The full audio of the meeting can be found on the home page of the church web site.

The Staff Support Team (Jan Johnson, Mike Enderly, Brenda Clark, Carolyn Madison, Lisa Duke and Rev. Drew Smith) announced that after 10+ years of serving CHPC Janis McLemore will be retiring at the end of August as the Finance and Human Resource Manager. Heather Lethander has agreed to be the new Finance and Human Resource Manager. Heather will start training on a part-time basis June 1 and come on full-time August 17. The team will be preparing opportunities to celebrate Janis in the future.

Also, Staff Support Team enthusiastically announced the removal of Interim designation from Robyn Hubbuch. She will be the Director of Children and Family Ministries for the foreseeable future. We thank God for Robyn's continued service.

The Staff Support Team also described the process for exploring a new Assistant Pastor. In ECO, our new denomination, the session with the Pastor has the freedom to pursue Assistant Pastors without the lengthy process of a Pastoral Search Team. We have identified the need for a colleague with Pastor Drew in pastoral leadership and preaching. A more direct search for a seasoned pastor with experience in multi-cultural leadership is underway. Please be in prayer for these transitions and search.

Robyn Hubbuch and Andrew Wells reported on the direction they are headed with the Children, Youth and Family Ministries: to bring glory to God by equipping students to be disciples of Jesus who make disciples of Jesus. They talked about how their recent changes to programs including MEGABLAST, FX night, and discipleship huddles, have brought in many new children and their families into our church. Summer ministries are also designed to bring in new children and families, so our big ask is for people from our church to come alongside these new families and help them get connected to the life of the church at CHPC. Thirdly, the Session has commissioned a Worship Task Force to seek God's guidance for how our worship gatherings would best capture God's desire for CHPC. The members of that team: Eileen Boyle, Cathy Lowe, Fran Kelley, Jerry Dwyer, Barb Rosen, Penny Sauer and Joe Brooks – seek your prayers for God's leading and want you to know that very soon they will be engaging the congregation in a discussion about worship. Their initial question for you, "When did you have significant experiences in worship?"

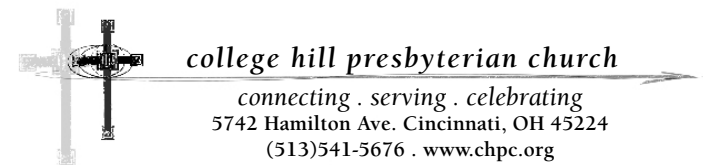
