We encourage you to join thousands of other Christ Followers for Outpouring 2015 at the Cincinnati Gardens on Sunday May 31st at 3 PM. Last year, three thousand gathered to celebrate Pentecost Sunday together, and this year we expect even more as we cross racial, ethnic, and denominational boundaries through our unity in Jesus.

We are excited to share that our offering from this year's event will go to support Whole Again led by Pastor Gregory Chandler. During the Summer Months, Whole Again provides two meals and educational enrichment every week day to over a thousand children who are on free or reduced lunch programs during the school year. Given our city's 53% childhood poverty rate, we need this effort to reach even more children in 2015.
