\* All CYF Summer Interns will work with many ages of children and youth, but one intern will be assigned to each grade level of children (finishing K-5) for the summer. Each intern will work specifically with children of his or her grade level at our church and in the community by:

- Being a counselor with that grade at Christ's Community Camp at the local elementary school for four weeks
- Being a camp counselor for that grade at our weeklong Resident Camp
- Leading a small group for that grade at BLAST on Sunday mornings

\* Interns will work together and with the CYF High School Interns to help plan, publicize, and lead Children, Youth and Family events such as FX (Family Experience) Night, MEGABLAST (4th-6th grade youth group), and CRASH (7th-12th grade youth group).

\* Interns will be mentored and challenged to evaluate their own spiritual growth and ministry performance throughout the summer.

## Summer Series Begins Adult Spiritual Formation

Today Adult Spiritual Formation will begin its summer series of classes. These classes will continue through the months of June and July and in some cases into August. If you have not yet signed up for a class it is not too late; pick one of the following and grow.

### Gospel of Luke - Fellowship Hall

The four gospels Matthew, Mark, Luke and John tell of the life of Jesus. Luke is sometimes called the Gospel of Mercy, and at other times the Gospel of Amazement or the Gospel of Prayer. Written especially for a gentile (non-Jewish) audience Luke begins with the birth of Jesus and continues to his ascension into heaven. Pastor Drew is excited about this class. Led by Drew Smith at 10:10 (No class limit).

### Book of Daniel - Worship And Arts Area - Ministry Center

A discussion of some of the Bible's famous characters who faced a moment that required complete trust in God's provision. We will draw from both Old and New Testament stories such as Isaac and Abraham, Moses at the Red Sea, Paul on the road to Damascus and in jail, among others. Each class is "stand alone" session and summer vacation plans will not interfere. Attend as many times as your schedule permits. Led by Scott Rice at 10:10 (Class limited to 15 people).

### Too Busy Not to Pray - Room C - Ministry Center Basement

Based on the book by Bill Hybels. Too Busy Not to Pray this class about prayer life requires some homework. Like all worthwhile things in life, just popping in unprepared won't allow a person to get the most from this class. Led by Fran Kelley at 10:10 (Class limited to 15 people).

### Married and Still Loving It - White House

Based on the book of the same title by Gary Chapman. This class focuses on the joys and challenges of the second half of marriage, although newlyweds will grow through this class as well. Led by Jeanne Schneider at 10:10 (Class limited to 15 people).

### Right Brain Biblical Experience - Clubroom - Ministry Center Basement

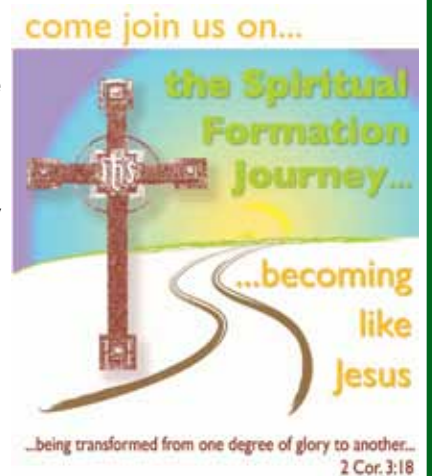
