## Real Life Wisdom

Last Sunday we rode the roller coaster of life in Ecclesiastes 3. We discussed how on this adventure, easy answers to difficult problems don't exist. For example, when fellow human beings approach us to ask for money we wonder, what is the most loving answer? We have Biblical guidelines that are like the tracks of a train but sometimes we go up and sometimes we go down, sometimes to the right and sometimes to the left on these tracks. The God-directed response may not always be the same.

So, how do we love those God brings to us asking for money? What do we know for sure?

- The Greatest Commandment: Love God with all your heart, mind, soul and strength; and love your neighbor as yourself. (Matthew 22:37-39) We always want obey God and do what is best for the other person.
- Every human being is of equal value – created in the image of God and part of the world that God loves and Jesus came to save. (Genesis 1:27, John 3:16) We always treat others with respect. Find out their name and call them by name.
- God is at work in every situation to form Christ in us. (Romans 8: 28-29) We always ask, "God what are you teaching me? How are you changing me?"

From these passages, anytime someone approaches us we see another human being with a name and a story. We want to do above all what God wants us to do in that moment. Ask God with a simple jab prayer, "God help. What should I do?" We also know that God uses everything to help teach us so ask, "God what are you teaching me? How do I learn to love in this situation?"

Consider how these Proverbs call us to care for the poor and also oppose wickedness and laziness.

- We give to the poor. Proverbs 19:17 "One who is gracious to a poor man lends to the LORD, And He will repay him for his good deed."
- We oppose wickedness and help those in need. Proverbs 21:12,13 "The Righteous One observes the house of the wicked; he throws the wicked down to ruin. Whoever closes his ear to the cry of the poor will himself call out and not be answered." (ESV)
- We encourage all to work and we help all to fight the sins of laziness and addiction. Proverbs 21:25,26 "The craving of the lazy person is fatal, for lazy hands refuse to labor. All day long the wicked covet, but the righteous give and do not hold back."

We are called to give to the poor and to avoid promoting poor choices in others or in ourselves.

Trust God's leading in your decisions. Here are some possibilities to consider:

- If folks need food – give them a Kroger card, offer to buy them food at local restaurants, or tell them about Christ's Community in College Hill (CCCH) – which is open Monday-Thursday mornings and can always help with food. CCCH is located across the parking lot from CHPC building at 5819 Salvia – 513.541.0303 – Ralph and Lisa Williams serve all at CCCH.
- If folks need gasoline – offer to take them to a gas station for gas.
- If folks need bus fare – take them to the bus stop to pay for their fare.

Remember your desire is to love God and neighbor. If you are feeling a deep sense of unease then apologize to the person and say, "I'm sorry I can't help you right now." It can be a loving answer to tell another person, "No."

At every opportunity, be open to how God may be teaching you, building in you a deeper trust of God, and developing a wise and godly heart. This is real life wisdom.

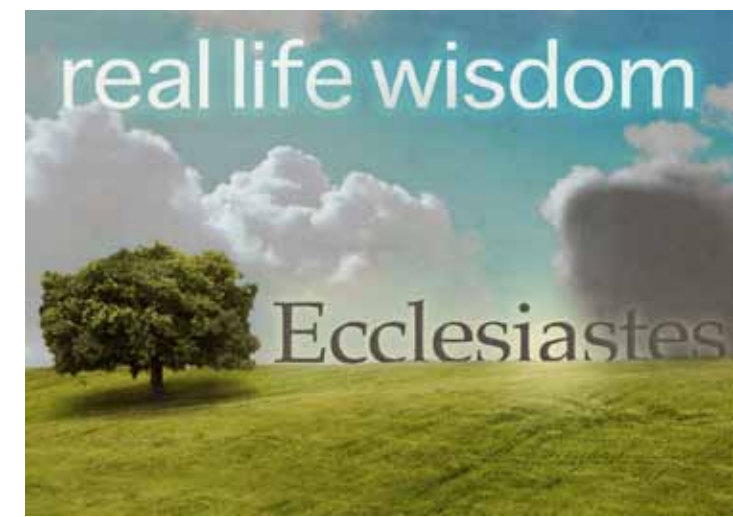
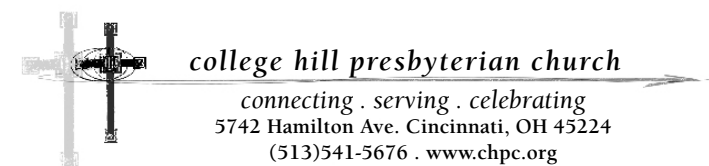
