At our Sunday morning services, four of the ushers are ordained Deacons and four are volunteer ushers called Ministry Partners. The Ministry Partners play a key role in welcoming guests and church family every Sunday.

Here's what Ministry Partners serving as ushers do: They greet people and distribute bulletins at the sanctuary entrances. They ring the bell, light and extinguish the candles, collect the offering, and direct people who look lost. After the service they pick up the attendance sheets and any leftover bulletins or trash.

Some of the Ministry Partners are former Deacons who miss getting up 30 minutes early. Others are just very helpful, friendly people with a servant's heart. Being a Ministry Partner is a good way for new members to get connected with the Church and meet new people.

You can serve as often as you like. We only ask you to serve one service on a Sunday. A few agree to serve only once a quarter. We try not to ask more often than once every two months. To volunteer or get more information call David Freas day or night at 513-910-7068.

ARMCHAIR ADVENTURES IN OUTDOOR PHOTOGRAPHY

Brian Jorg, nature photographer, public speaker, and Cincinnati Zoo horticulturalist, will be our guest speaker at SUPPER CLUB on Monday evening, September 28. Brian travels the world to capture the beauty of nature in photographic images. The "one-of-a-kind" presentation will focus on some of the "adventures" he has encountered over the years researching, photographing, and observing nature in the great outdoors. This sometimes humorous look back includes close encounters, from grizzlies and black bear to rattlesnakes and tarantulas, as well as reflecting on some of the most magnificent landscapes, from Alaska to East Africa and the Amazon to Nova Scotia.



Prior to joining the Zoo, Brian was a horticulturist at Spring Grove Cemetery and Arboretum. His responsibilities at the Zoo include managing the Native Plant Program. This program includes the conservation, education, and promotion of native flora. Finding more efficient manners of propagation and cultivation are a prime goal of this program. These protocols can then be used on rare and endangered plants in conservation efforts. Brian also manages the tulip display, in which over 100,000 bulbs are planted seasonally.

Brian's passion is outdoor photography. To date, Brian has had his photographs published in various books, magazines, field guides, calendars, advertisements and greeting cards. Numerous institutions also use Brian's images in their educational displays. Brian often travels more than 20,000 miles a year on photographic trips, including such destinations as Newfoundland, Nova Scotia, Alaska, and the Yucatan. Brian has also led safaris to Kenya, East Africa, Peruvian Amazon, Galapagos Islands, South Africa, Namibia, Botswana and Victoria Falls.
