

Whiz Kids and Treehouse Need Volunteers for this School Year

"All week I think about Treehouse and I just get excited when Tuesday comes," a fourth grade boy said last year. "It's my favorite part of the week."

One of the tutors also said it was the highlight of his week.

The difference one adult can make in the life of a child is immeasurable, even if they are only together for an hour a week. That's why we invite volunteers from CHPC and other College Hill churches to join us at Pleasant Hill on Tuesday evenings for Whiz Kids and Treehouse Tutoring.

Both programs have coordinators preparing materials behind the scenes so that volunteers only need to show up and work with the children.

Whiz Kids, coordinated by Mandy Wells, focuses on adults or youth over 16 helping first, second and third graders learn to read. Volunteers work with one child to read through books that match the child's reading level, then they do fun writing and drawing activities as well as games, to deepen understanding and build vocabulary.

Treehouse, coordinated by Colleen Scheid, focuses on literacy too, but also aims to build character and faith by using CHPC's Blast curriculum, with Bible passages as reading material. Drama, games and discussion based on the character qualities found in the Bible stories make Treehouse fun and interactive for these older students. They will also be challenged to grow as leaders by doing some of these activities with younger children the next week. Treehouse tutors usually participate in an opening group activity, then work with two students on reading and discussion.

Pleasant Hill Principal, Shauna McDowell and Recourse Coordinator, Tim Walker, have expressed their deep appreciation to our volunteers for the work they have done, and cite our programs as one of the reasons that Pleasant Hill Reading scores have improved markedly in the last few years.

Please spread the word to anyone who likes working with kids that Whiz Kids and Treehouse need more volunteers. We have an unprecedented opportunity to reach children and families at Pleasant Hill, with staff assuring us that they will supply us with as many students as we can find tutors for.

Meet George Remus – King of the Bootleggers

Monday evening, September 22, Supper Club will have the unique privilege of hearing Mark Plageman, Professor Emeritus of Miami University. He will be introducing us to a man who a "proper Professor Emeritus" wouldn't want to be associated with – George Remus. His interest in George Remus goes back to his childhood when he and his cousins played cops and robbers on Remus's 10 acre estate in Price Hill.

George Remus, originally a pharmacist and later a lawyer, used his knowledge of pharmacy and law to circumvent the Volstead Act to buy distilleries that had gone out of business due to prohibition, on the pretext of selling it for "medicinal purposes". He became the largest supplier of quality booze to folks like Al Capone, Lucky Luciano, Arnold Rothstein, and Nucky Thompson. Remus moved to Cincinnati because allegedly, over 60 percent of the commercial distilleries were within 100 miles of here. He made millions. There are many interesting stories about his life, including originating the "temporary insanity" defense.
