## CHPC "Joyful Noise" Children's Choir is recruiting children ages 6-12

Why would a children's choir program be an integral part of congregational worship and church life at CHPC?

- First of all, a children's choir would give children an opportunity to serve their church community. Sunday school, Vacation Bible-school, and other activities minister to children, but having a choir gives children a chance to minister to others through music.
- Second, participation in a choir would give children an opportunity to take a leadership role in the service. It would give them a sense of responsibility for the ministry of the church and helps them identify with the traditional form of worship as they grow to adulthood.
- Third, a children's choir would provide opportunities for them to build Christian character. A choir is a team with a common goal; the qualities of promptness, self-control, cooperation, and commitment must be developed in choir members if the group is to accomplish its purpose of praising the Lord.
- Fourth, a children's choir is a part of the education process. When children sing Scripture, they remember it for a lifetime. Reflecting on the message of a song they sing would instill understanding of spiritual truths and knowledge of God which will lead them to a sound relationship with Jesus Christ.
- Finally, unchurched families in the community can be drawn to the church through their children's involvement in the worship service. Singing in a choir not only adds the beauty of music to them and their lives but also life-long skills, and character traits that will have a huge influence on the choices they make as adults.

## GOTHIC AUTHOR J.T. TOWNSEND TO SPEAK AT SUPPER CLUB

When their first child was kidnapped from their home in 1932 and found murdered in the woods, Charles and Ann Lindbergh were the most famous couple in America, and the case would become the most publicized crime of the 20th century. Eventually suspect Bruno Richard Hauptmann was convicted and executed for killing "Baby Charlie". But this delayed justice did nothing to answer the questions and controversies that still surround the case and confound armchair detectives 80 years later.

Join Queen City Gothic author J.T. Townsend as he takes a fresh look at the kidnapping. As one of the rare writers to actually tour the Lindbergh house in Hopewell, New Jersey, he combines contemporary photographs of the crime scene with archival images from the time period to create a unique perspective on this notorious crime. By interweaving forensic analysis and psychological profiling, Townsend laces the evidence into a shockingly rational theory that will forever close the book on the death of the Lindbergh baby.




