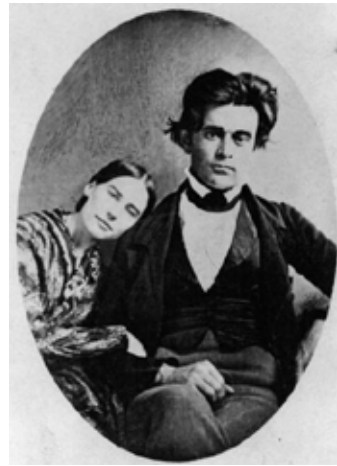
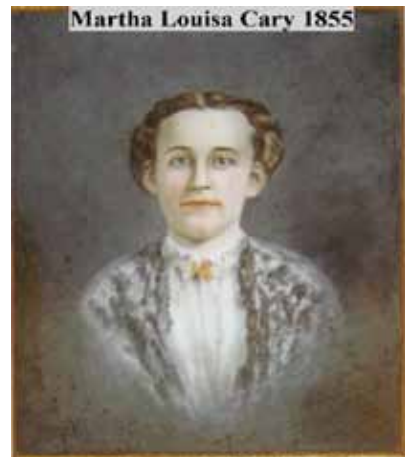


The College Hill Historical Society Presents...



The Cary and Huber Family

Jan Huber, a descendant of William and Rebecca Fenton Cary, who were the founders of College Hill, and their son General Samuel F. Cary, will be visiting



from Arizona to make a special presentation on the history of his family. Huber will talk about Gen. Cary's daughter Martha Louise Cary who married Charles B Huber, son of abolitionist John "Boss" Huber of Clermont County.

William Cary purchased 491 acres of land, at \$7 per acre in 1813, which became the core of College Hill. The Cary family proceeded to make an indelible mark in the civic, spiritual, educational and literary landscape of the community across the next century. William Cary was an early justice of the peace, state legislator and a founder of the Presbyterian Church.

Two Cary sons had remarkable careers: Freeman Grant Cary was an educator and promoter of agricultural science and founded Cary's Academy and later the Farmers' College. General Samuel Fenton Cary was active in reform and politics and became a nationally acclaimed speaker on temperance, represented Cincinnati in Congress, was a candidate for vice president with Horace Greeley and was the first local historian.
