For many "Travel is broadening" for its educational value. For my husband Barry and me, however, travel is a spiritual journey that God uses to prompt us to action. Our September visit to Germany and Poland was no exception. There images fill the international TV, newspapers and 'travelers' crossed our path. We knew that God was at work in mighty ways. There was no way to escape seeing that Europe was changing!

On Sept 6, I wrote to friends: "Occasionally we have seen signs of a healthy church, but much of Germany seems soulless. The flood of refugees from Syria and the east will be spiritually devastating unless the Church wakes up! We are just starting to see the flood. It will be huge. Like the past threats to Europe from the Mongolian and Ottoman hoards, Muslim easterners and the soulless westerners will collide in Europe. What a time in history."

We returned to Cincinnati and were amazed that there was a *news vacuum* on the European crisis except

for an occasional report of 'another boatload of refugees drowning in the Mediterranean.'

The CHPC Missions Team encouraged me to add requests for prayer and study to the church ePrayer emails. These included links to articles, photos and internet sites for more information — places to see the needs.

Oct 27th, Global Mission Worker Kathy Angi spoke to a group candidly about the 'refugee crisis' and gave specific ways in which 'strangers' are being welcomed.

The needs are astronomical. In this year alone, *more than 700,000 mostly Muslim people have crossed the Mediterranean fleeing war and persecution.* As winter approaches the influx is increasing — over 200,000 in October. The European Union is reeling and costs are mounting daily. One of my early questions to Barry was, "Are we witnessing the beginning of the death of the EU and of Christianity in Europe?" I pray not.

The Church's Liturgical Year: Celebrating Reformation Day!

These are not *Trick or Treaters*. The day is correct however. What the world calls Halloween is a contraction of All Hallows' Evening or All Saints' Eve - the Western Christian feast of All Hallows' Day - honoring Christian believers who had died. 498 years ago on Oct 31, Martin Luther nailed his 95 theses on the door of All Saints Church, the Castle Church of Wittenberg Germany. God used Luther's *questions for discussion*, and his contemporaries to birth the Protestant Reformation and, in turn, the Roman Catholic Counter-Reformation. Christ's Church was renewed. Reformation Day is a reminder that all believers are 'saints' called to celebrate God's reforming of His Church today. That's no 'trick!'

For 15 years, God has used *Tools for Schools* as practical means of expressing Christ's love and care for children

—this year over 13,000 children in 29 city schools — where many families are living below the 'poverty line.'

This year, *Tools for Schools* focused on Crayons and Cash for buying in bulk. "One of the *tools* in highest demand is crayons," said Bev Graves, Feast of Love Director, coordinator for *Tools for Schools*. "A box of 24 crayons costs about \$2 except during *Back-to-School* specials in July and August when boxes can be bought for 25¢. We had requests for 8500. Thanks to the generosity of members and friends from supporting churches, we were able to provide 2831 boxes. Next year, we will send out information at the beginning of the summer, so people can watch for sales and buy crayons."

"Spiral notebooks and crayons are the only item we cannot buy in bulk at terrific savings. For example, Elmer's Glue Sticks (14¢), Ballpoint pens (8¢), Pencils (6¢), Scissors (50¢) are prices obtained



by buying in bulk and having suppliers bid for our needs. So we are able to stretch a donation of \$20 to provide the Basic Tools for 2 ½ students.

On Aug 17, 29 volunteers distributed 104,174 items: 35,352 pencils,

14,110 pencils, 14,244 glue sticks, 5088 scissors, 2831 crayons, 15,750 spiral note-books, and 16,799 portfolios.
