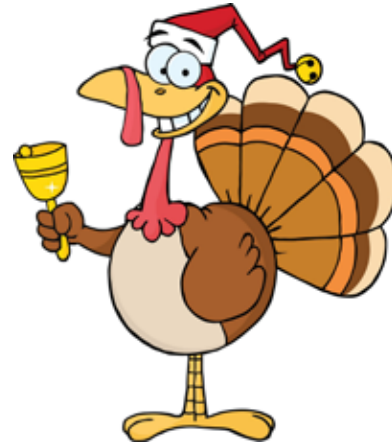

THERE BE A GIANT AMONG US

Come to Fellowship Hall on Monday evening, November 24, to hear an amazing story. Matt Wilbur, a man of courage and determination, has a message for all of us.

Matt is a retired math teacher and coach (basketball and football) from Mount Vernon High School and Kenyon College. In 2006 the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, Ohio Legends, voted him “Huddle Coach of the Year.” Matt has run 35 marathons including New York City, Boston, Columbus, Cleveland, Toledo, and Athens. His personal best is 2:59:40.

Early last spring, Matt walked 350 miles of the Camino de Santiago, an ancient pilgrimage through Spain. He hopes to return in the spring of 2015 to complete the 500 mile journey from St. Jean, France to Santiago de Compostela, Spain.

In 2002 Matt was diagnosed with Parkinson’s, a neurological disease which as of today has no cure. He has been a member of the Michael J. Fox Foundation for Parkinson’s Research for six years raising funds and awareness. His positive attitude and faith have inspired thousands to overcome “bad” situations that come into all of our lives.

He has published two books: “One Step Ahead of Parkinson’s Disease,” and “It Doesn’t Get Any Better Than This.” Here’s a quote from one of them: “Walk each day in anticipation, that around any corner, at any moment in time, God can bless your life, despite the circumstances.”



Matt and his wife, Julie, both retired in 2010 and moved to Finneytown to be near their two daughters and seven grandchildren. You can see the family filling up the front seats on the right at second service every Sunday.

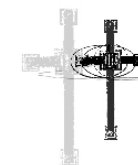
