Working In Neighborhoods (WIN) Hall of Fame Induction

On November 10, CHPC's own Ed Wells was inducted into WIN's Hall of Fame for his extraordinary contributions to the vitality of College Hill. The ceremony was held on November 10th at the Hyatt Regency, downtown. Below is the write up about Ed from the Hall of Fame program.

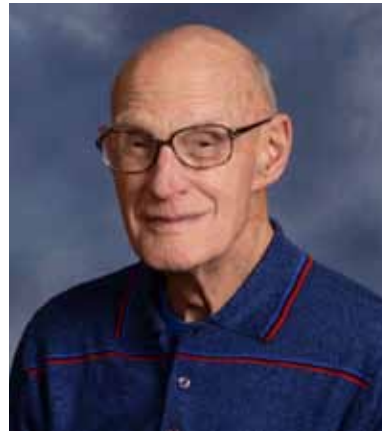
Ed Wells is an innovator and a civic leader. Upon moving to College Hill in 2005, Mr. Wells threw himself into the work of improving his adopted community. As a member of the College Hill Housing Team, Mr. Wells engaged Working In Neighborhoods to help revitalize the Cedar Avenue corridor that badly needed new housing-and new hope. Mr. Wells has been an advisor, advocate and investor. He has recruited volunteers, rallied the neighbors' support, and even mowed the grass.

In addition to working with WIN, Mr. Wells provides valuable assistance to the College Hill Community Urban Redevelopment Corporation and the College Hill Business Association. In 2007, Mr. Wells was presented the College Hill Forum's Josh Weiser award for outstanding volunteerism.

One of Mr. Wells' proudest achievements is completing the capital campaign for the Margaret Jean Wells Chapel at Llanfair Retirement Home, dedicated to his late wife. Mr. Wells is grateful for his 40-year career at Procter & Gamble where an assignment to improve paper towels resulted in the Bounty brand. He is the father of a son and has three grandchildren.

Mr. Wells is known for building intricate, historically accurate model ships. His interest in boats started as a young man when he built a rowboat and two sailboats. He now helps build homes where they are most needed.

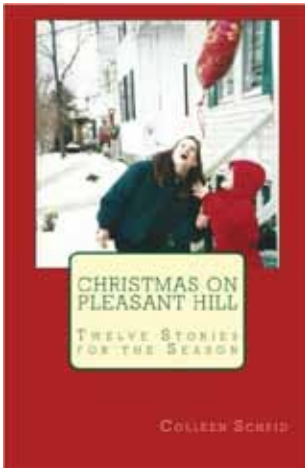
The next time you see him, be sure to congratulate Ed and thank for his dedication to College Hill and CHPC.

Although the stories in "Christmas on Pleasant Hill" are fictional, the settings are real locations in College Hill, with many stories centering around the life of a church which happens to be a lot like CHPC.

The author, Colleen Scheid, said, "No one has to worry about showing up in this book! (Although I couldn't resist quoting my kids when they were little a few times.) But a lot of the stories do come out of experiences I've had or witnessed from living here and attending this church for so many years. That's why I dedicated the book to CHPC - I love our church and I'm so grateful to so many people here!"

The stories are about people of all ages and backgrounds - rich and poor, black and white, old and young - just like the people of College Hill. While most are family-friendly, it is not a children's book.

"Christmas on Pleasant Hill" will be available for \$10 on Sunday mornings after Thanksgiving after the first and second services.

CHPC member Barbara Runck makes it easy. She has written Liz Finds a Forever Home - an endearing story about a wonderful dog, a great family pet with not one, but two careers in her life. Liz found her forever home with College Hill residents, the Runcks.

Barbara's neighbor Beth McLean said the book "is particularly heart-warming to me, because I see the story line as one which reflects [Barbara's] own life changes, not just those of her beloved dog, Liz...The story itself is beautifully illustrated in carefully crafted pencil drawings, so both the words on the page and accompanying visuals combine to bring Liz and her mission to life." Liz's mission is to go to nursing homes, hospice or hospitals and visit those in need of unconditional love.
