

The Church's Liturgical Year: Advent of Hope not Wishes

What do you see? What does this symbol have to do with Advent?

The Advent season is a time of preparation that directs our hearts and minds to the anniversary of Jesus Christ's birth and His second coming at the end of time. In these trying times of terrorist threats, war, death, stress and pain, **CHPC's Advent Preaching Series focuses on HOPE...real hope.**

As a grade school child, preparing for the Winter Holidays was confusing at best. No holly and ivy at my school, just silver and blue. My parents arrived for the Holiday Pageant and learned I could dance the *horah*. Carols were sung in English and Chanukah songs in Hebrew. What fun! Then my family went home to watch the electric train circle our tinsel tree. Cookies were baked and presents made for *our* holiday celebration that was somehow different. Both holiday celebrations are rooted in miracles of God. But my family missed that message. Holidays floated by on traditions and whatever the current emotions were until 'Christmas' came.

There was no place in my life for Advent until I knew the 'babe in the manger' as my Savior and Lord. I became part of a worshipping church that celebrated Advent for *four weeks*. We considered what we did not have to do before Christmas. We considered how we could use the time to fall more in love with Christ and pass that love on to others.

Advent colors, textures, sounds, scents and stories enriched the days. We made time to learn of the 'fullness of time' into which Christ came. We learned of God the Father's love given so we could reflect His Glory. Rather than depression, fear and anxiety, THE HOPE of the world, Jesus Christ bursts into life anew.

So what does all this have to do with the odd triangular symbol?

For starters, the design is the Celtic symbol for HOPE. It is made up of two 'never-ending' symbols, a ring and a triquetra — a triangular shape. If you place a pencil on either of these shapes and trace a path around them, you would return to your starting point.

The triquetra was used by pagans in Northern Europe and artists in Japan. When Christians added the interwoven circle, the Celtic knot became a symbol of God's love revealed by the Holy Trinity. Interestingly, this symbol predates the use of the cross in worship settings. Rock stars to video games to TV show have adopted all or part of the design without much thought to its real meaning.

REAL HOPE vs WISHES

That rousing chorus of 'We *Wish* You a Merry Christmas...' or signing Christmas

/Holiday *Wishes* on a greeting card, plays into the confusion of the season. In English, we use the word 'wish' to refer to things that are impossible or won't happen: "I wish I could fly" or "I wish Christmas would come faster."

By contrast, using 'I hope' or 'Hope' as a noun occurs when there is a good chance or a certainty about something. That's why the Celtic symbol is such a good reminder of

• Hope in the eternal God — Father, Son and Holy Spirit — *the Trinity is a sure thing.*

• *God's plan is a sure thing.* Christ has come. Christ is coming. Christ is coming again.

• *And the end of time is a sure thing.* No matter what else happens...God Wins! He is the HOPE of every tribe and every nation.

FOCUS ON THE LOOPS in the design.

See the vertical loop extending with the other two? Let your imagination go. What do you see?

God breathing life into humanity, male and female? God reaching out to you and me, and through us to others?

A God on High connecting with Ordinary People... to change the world? How about a candle and a candleholder?



For future Sundays in Advent, we'll talk about other aspects of the symbol of HOPE. Here's an Advent reading that flows out of the image of a vertical candle being held in a candleholder.

ADVENT READING: Light the First Advent Candle

Today we light the first candle of Advent. In this season when days grow shorter, when there is more darkness than light, we can feel that hope is equally fleeting. Yet God's Word assures us that light shines in the darkness and the darkness has not, cannot, and never will overcome it. So we light a candle to remind us that, in Jesus Christ, light has come into the world — not a fleeting or temporary light, but a living, breathing light. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world." Then God said to *ordinary people*: "I have made you a light for the Gentiles, that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth."
