# The Church's Liturgical Year: Advent - The Plans of God in the Hands of God.



# THIS IS A TEST

What do you see? What does this symbol have to do with Advent?

The Advent season in the life of the Church is a time of preparation for the celebration of Jesus Christ's birth and His second coming at the end of time. In these trying times, CHPC's 2015 Advent Preaching Series focuses on HOPE... real hope.

Last week, Nov 29th, we introduced the Celtic symbol for Hope. Christians combined a never-ending, interwoven circle with a Celtic knot — a symbol of God's love revealed by the Holy Trinity. This whole symbol predates the use of the cross by Christians.

The first Sunday of Advent, this part of the symbol was used. Looking like a candle on a stand, it pointed



to Jesus Christ, the HOPE and Light of the World who comes to ordinary men and women ...people open to God: like Mary, Joseph and John the Baptist in the backwater area of Nazareth.



This 2nd Sunday of Advent, we take the same symbol and invert it, so it seems to rest on a center point with outstretched hands, a bit like a spinning top. It is a reminder of *the plans of God in the hands of God*. The Apostle Paul wrote about these plans to the Galatians (4:4,5): *But when the time had fully come*, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law, to redeem those who were under the law, so that we might receive adoption as sons. Other translations use the phrase, *"In the fullness of time...."* 

Jesus was born into a country under the military rule of the Romans. The King, Herod and his family weren't even from King David's royal line. How was this the 'fullness of time?'

It wasn't until I took a graduate course in the Intertestamental Period that I began to see God's Plan. Before Herod, before the Romans, the Jews had been *FREE*. The *Apocrypha* is part of the Catholic and Orthodox Bibles. It contains *the Books* of the *Maccabees* written in Hebrew by a Jewish author after the restoration of an *independent Jewish kingdom*, about the latter part of the 2nd century BC.

In the 3rd century BC, Alexander the Great and his Greek successors conquered Israel. The Maccabee family called upon people loyal to the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob to oppose the invaders and the Jews who preferred the Greek culture. They trusted God, courageously undertook a bloody military campaign and won!

In 165 BC, the Temple in Jerusalem was reconsecrated so ritual sacrifices could begin again. According to Rabbinic tradition, the victorious Maccabees could only find a small jug of sacred oil to burn in the Menorah (lampstand) to rededicate

God's Holy Temple. Miraculously, one night's worth of oil lasted for eight nights.

Hanukkah: an annual reminder.
The Jewish Festival of Lights Hanukk

The Jewish Festival of Lights, Hanukkah, was established to remind Jews of God's provision and their *Freedom*. A favorite game of Hanukkah is playing with a dreidel, a four sided spinning top. The Hebrew letters on each side spell

out the phrase "there happened a great miracle." Pray that



this season the Jews will come to know God's Plan and greatest miracle — Jesus.

Over the years, instead of trusting God's Plan, the Jews made an alliance with the powerful Roman Republic. God set His people free, but they sold themselves into bondage to other gods. Their only HOPE was for a Messiah.

This was the 'fullness of time' into which Christ came. From Genesis to Revelation, God continues to speak forth His Plans to any who will listen. The prophets and ordinary people throughout history foretold His faithfulness and His miracles. At His chosen time — His Word was made flesh and dwelled among us. To those who believed in Jesus' name He gave the power to be sons of God.

That's God's Plan — to have children to reflect His Glory. Could this Advent be a 'fullness of time' for you? Will Jesus Christ set you free from your past and give you a future and a HOPE?


