

The Church's Liturgical Year : Fat Tuesday and Lent

Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it...Christ is the head of the Church, His body, of which He is the Savior.

1 Cor 12:27 and Ephesians 5:23

The Apostle Paul declared that the Church is the *living* 'Body of Christ' - no debate about it. Over the centuries, the Church has identified rhythms or patterns that are helpful to its life, much like other organisms. Liturgical seasons are a perfect example. Understanding and embracing the Church's Liturgical Year can enrich the whole Church and deepen our own personal relationship with Christ.

How? The whole purpose of liturgy in worship is "to have the life of Christ be real and contemporary in the lives of believers." It's how God equips "His people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up." Eph 4:12. God can do that individually but He will do that when 2 or 3 are gathered. After all, the Sunday morning gathering of the Body is called *A Service of Worship... of God* — Father, Son & Holy Spirit.

Mardi Gras and Lent
A historic rhythm of the Church is God's pattern of fasting and feasting. Today few seek God to provide their daily bread. Outside the Church, fewer still talk about, let alone practice the biblical concepts of *delayed gratification* or sacrifice. The contrast between the World and the Church is especially obvious between 'The Three Kings Day' (12 days after Christmas) and Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent.

In much of the world, this period is known for *Mardi Gras*, French for *Fat Tuesday*. In England they use the word

Shrove. Envisioned by the Catholic/Anglican traditions as a modest celebration of eating special sweets or rich foods before the penitential time of Lent, Mardi Gras has become badly distorted. In New Orleans, Rio de Janeiro and other cities around the globe Mardi Gras is a consuming marketing project. [70% of Rio's tourists come during the multi-week event.] Mardi Gras is now known for wearing masks and scandalous costumes, overturning social conventions, sport and dance competitions, LGBT pride parades and debauchery.

Some countries still maintain aspects of their Christian heritage in spite of the world's efforts to *hijack* the feast. Venice and the Netherlands are known for their lavish, but respectful Carnivals [Latin *carne(m) levare* means "to take away meat"]. The one or two-day celebrations punctuate the end of feasting and the beginning of Lent, leading up to Easter.

Ash Wednesday...Gateway to Fasting with a Purpose. In the Bible,

Jews regularly fasted and prayed to God. Ashes on the forehead let others know that a person was grieved over the sin that separated them from God: "*Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.*"

For Christian believers, ashes applied on the forehead in the sign of the cross testify that Christ fully paid for Sin on the cross. The vertical mark is for God's personal relationship with His creation; the horizontal mark for all believers united in Christ to declare the love and grace of God... and to give God the Glory He is due.

Often the ashes are made from palm branches saved from the previous year's Palm Sunday...completing the annual cycle of a liturgical year.

Receive the ashes and pray, "*God create in me a desire to know you more deeply during Lent 2016... grant me a spirit of humility and sacrifice.*" Then, watch and listen...God will choose an ideal *fast* just for you.

LENTEN FAMILY/ SMALL GROUP ACTIVITY: Lent is the 7 week period of prayer, fasting and sacrifice leading up to Holy Week. To grow in remembering key events in Christ's life, try this when 2 or 3 are together. Light 7 candles. Each week extinguish one more while repeating the meaning of each candle...like the reverse of the Advent candle lighting...for The Light leaving the world. The readings focus on a **PLACE**, an **EVENT**, and a **DISAPPOINTMENT EXPERIENCED BY CHRIST**.

LEADER READING: During Lent we mark Jesus' journey from Egypt to Jerusalem and the Cross by extinguishing a candle each week.

OTHERS REPLY: Today we extinguish the **seventh candle** — **EGYPT** — a reminder of the **PERIL** Jesus faced as a baby. After Christ's birth in Bethlehem, the first step on His journey was to **flee to Egypt to escape death at the hands of King Herod.**
