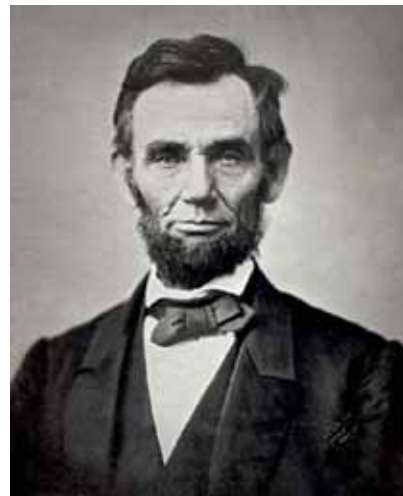

THE LINCOLN ASSASSINATION 150 YEARS LATER

Supper Club (remember it's for adults of any age) will have an exceptional speaker this month. JT Townsend is a freelance writer and author. He is a Cincinnati, resident of Wyoming, and graduate of Miami University. He is author of the 2009 regional best seller Queen City Gothic. . . Cincinnati's Most Infamous Murder Mysteries. He is the former crime historian for Snitch Magazine, and his work has appeared in The Cincinnati Inquirer, Cincinnati Magazine, Word Magazine, and Clews. As part of his True Crime Lecture Series, he has presented over 150 programs in the Cincinnati area.



The assassination of Abraham Lincoln was the crime of the 19th century, and spawned one of the most notorious trials in American History. Just five days after the Civil War ended, the president was gunned down by actor John Wilkes Booth.

The assassination has always been examined by historians as an act of political post-war terrorism, committed by a fanatic who may have been sponsored by the Confederacy. But rarely has Lincoln's death been investigated by detectives as a murder case.

Come to Supper Club (all adults welcome) and watch JT Townsend discard the myths and legends surrounding the assassination, while excavating the truth about the conspiracy to kill Lincoln. With stunning images and riveting content, the author of Queen City Notorious and Queen City Gothic solves the mystery that still surrounds the death of our most beloved president.

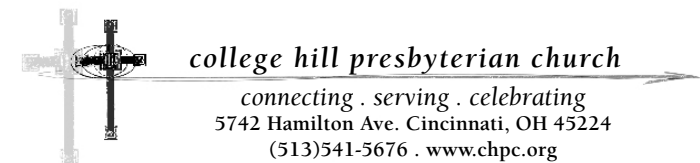
