A 'WANTED' PRODIGY FOR CHRIST

JOHN CALVIN (JEHAN CAUVIN) BORN 1509 IN NOYON FRANCE NORTH OF PARIS AND DIED 1564 IN GENEVA SWITZERLAND.

Few people in the 2,000 year history of the Christian church are more recognizable and controversial than John Calvin. High school students in AP European history learn about his influence on the political structure of Geneva. Theologians, pastors, and laity have continued to argue the merits of Calvinism, followers of John Calvin, over and against Arminianism, followers of Jacob Arminius.

A brilliant scholar, Calvin entered law school at age 20 and was fluent in Greek and Latin. Although raised in the Roman Catholic church, he did not have a meaningful religious experience until his conversion in 1533. Then at age 27, three years after becoming a Christian, the 'prodigy' published the first edition of his masterwork, *The Institutes of Christian Religion*. He wrote it as an elementary instruction book for anyone interested in the Christian faith. [What a contrast to many 'babes in the faith,' myself included, who struggled to find the motivation to attend church each Sunday.] Calvin would later revise and enlarge his *Institutes* several times. It has been a 'best seller' among scholars, theologians and pastors for the last 500 years!

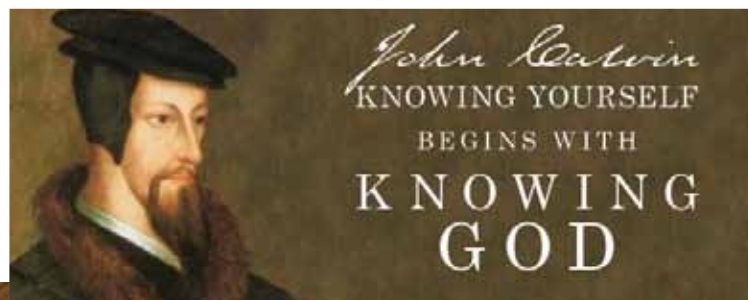
John Calvin's writing and preaching clearly refuted the teachings of the Roman Church. In France, he became a 'wanted' man with a price on his head. In fact, he was fleeing to Germany when he encountered William Farel in Geneva and was compelled by God to remain there.

Many are amazed by how much Calvin accomplished by age 55. Even more impressive is that he was only a Christian for the last 30 years of his life. The majority of Calvin's ministry was conducted in Geneva where his experience with the law and systematic theology was sorely tested.

16th century Geneva was probably a much more frightening place to build a church than any modern secular city. Initially, it was a city full of pain, suffering, and brokenness which Calvin confronted daily (for example, there was a law forbidding men from having more than one mistress). Calvin, Farel and others were used for major 'reformation' in this key European city.

Perhaps the best way to describe Calvin's personality is to say that he wouldn't care for this article unless the end result was people praising God. The sovereignty, supremacy, and goodness of God took top priority in Calvin's life. It led to famous quotes like this, "There is not one blade of grass, there is no color in this world that is not intended to make us rejoice [in God]."

Calvin's temperament was 'mellow and reserved,' in contrast to the fiery nature of his colleague Wm Farel, or of theologians Martin Luther and Ulrich Zwingli. One might wonder how such



a quiet man made so much noise on the international stage in politics and theology. Calvin explains, "A dog barks when his master is attacked. I would be a coward if I saw that God's truth is attacked and yet would remain silent." Calvin wasn't interested in making a name for himself or being the center of controversy, but his commitment to the glory of God led him to action.

After reading several biographies of Calvin over the years, I relate to his temperament and native timidity. For those who share this characteristic, we ought to thank God for the example given to us in John Calvin and ask God to give us the same spirit of boldness in ministry in our often hostile world!

THE JOHN CALVIN I LOVE

The cartoon at right captures one of Calvin's major teachings: the *total depravity of mankind*. As early as 400 AD, church leaders like St Augustine taught about the 'original sin' of Adam & Eve passed on to every person born into the world. Calvin said, "Apart from the efficacious, irresistible grace of God, we are utterly unable to choose to follow God or refrain from evil."

Calvin's really Good News was that *GOD enables us* to accept His loving gift of salvation by faith in *Christ alone*. When I acknowledged this, it was easy for me to 'give up' trying to run my life and making a mess of it. I confessed my sin and believed that Christ had died for ME. I experienced God's unconditional, liberating love for the first time. 48 years later, I still praise God for His *irresistible* grace.

The French Confession of Faith of 1559 was the only church confession framed by Calvin. [It was while studying this Confession that I discovered that John Calvin was born Jehan Cauvin and he wasn't Swiss, he was French!] In the French Confession, Calvin codified the practical implications of the Reformed Faith and unified French Huguenots — the French protestants who adopted Calvin's Reformed theology. Hundreds of thousands around the world have lived and died by this Confession.

Sola Scriptura — For Calvin, only the Bible could lead to a true knowledge of God and life. Without it, one is condemned to ignorance and sin. "Unless one has been taught by Holy Scripture," he wrote, "it is impossible to have even a slight taste of sound doctrine."

Calvin was a radical theologian. He taught three 'absolutes' as *divine revelations* rooted in Scripture —

- the sovereignty of God (over all He created for His own Glory);



- the equality of clergy and laity (natural equality, plus the equality of worth and dignity of every person); and
- the solidarity of mankind (the ties in a society that bind people together as one).

He preached, taught and lived these 'absolutes.' Calvin along with other 'free' thinkers of his time spread these radical concepts. They formed the theological bedrock of change — from life in Geneva to the American and French Revolutions to the Solidarity movement of 20th Century Poland.

Calvin found no biblical basis for the Roman Church's hierarchy of popes, cardinals, archbishops and bishops. So he established a biblical *Reformed* Form of Church Government: a *representative form of governance by Elders called by God and elected by the people being governed*. God-ordained Deacons, Pastors and Teachers serve as described in the New Testament. Calvin's Form of Government is in use today in Reformed Churches, especially Presbyterian ones.

Throughout his life, Calvin worked to establish the equally radical concept of *the separation of Church and State* in Geneva. Many of the signers of the *Declaration of Independence* and the *U.S. Constitution* came from Reformed Church backgrounds. It is no wonder that Calvin's Form of Government with its checks and balances and equality of Executive, Legislative and Judicial branches was key in the original design for the USA government of 1787.

On the 4th of July I reread the *Declaration of Independence*. I praised God for John Calvin and his theological heritage as I read these familiar words — ...We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed...

Over the years, I've grown to love and appreciate John Calvin. I urge you to learn more about him and why I'm very glad I didn't have to live in 16th Century Geneva with him!

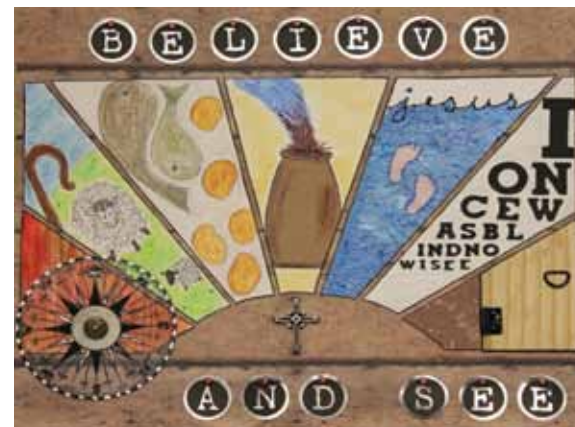

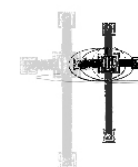
