Session has approved a statement which is the culmination of the sermon series and classes on worship which took place last January and February.

So what does this mean for you?

This statement about our worship culture here at CHPC will serve as the basis for a common language and focus that we share about worship. Please consider reflecting on the six words as you prepare to participate in our corporate worship culture each Sunday. To God be the Glory!

Worship is not a problem we need to solve, it is a gift that we get to open together.

Worship at CHPC

Therefore, I urge you, brothers, in view of God's mercy, to offer your bodies as living sacrifices, holy and pleasing to God—this is your spiritual act of worship. Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—His good, pleasing and perfect will. (Romans 12:1-2)

CHPC embraces a Sunday morning gathering that facilitates a joyful, contagious, interdependent, and God-glorifying worship culture where people are transformed and included in spite of circumstances or differences.

This is accomplished through planned opportunities that weekly encourage us to be:

EXPECTING God's invitation into His presence

Believing that God—Father, Son and Holy Spirit—is present and has invited us, we glorify Him by entering into His presence humbly with thanksgiving and praise. (Psalm 100, James 4:8)

We desire to be a supernatural community living with the certain knowledge that Christ has overcome sinful and man-made divisions based on generations, color, and economy through his unifying work on the cross. (Ephesians 2)

We invite and welcome all whom God draws together through Jesus. (Romans 15:7)

ENCOUNTERING God as He reveals Himself

We recognize and encourage the varied gifts, talents, and responses of our diverse church body to shape our corporate worship. (1Corinthians 12:4-13)

As we all actively participate in worship, God unites, matures and builds our unique personalities and roles into the body of Christ, a royal priesthood, a people of God who encounter Him differently together than we do separately. (Hebrews 10:19-25, 1Peter 2:9)

EXPERIENCING the Truth of God's Word as it speaks powerfully to the reality of our lives

Across peoples and nations, the Word of God, correctly understood through the Holy Spirit (1Corinthians 2:6-16), is the language of God's Kingdom culture.

All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the man of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work. (2Timothy 3:16-17)

STRUGGLING with challenge to change

With the Spirit's leading, we share stories of our struggles and victories with other believers.

SURRENDERING all that we are to God

As we continually offer ourselves in prayer to God, He transforms us into the likeness of His Son (Romans 8:26-29) and empowers us to do greater works than Jesus (John 14:12-17)

SENT as transformed people to make disciples

Then Jesus came to them and said, "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me. Therefore go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." (Matthew 28:18-20)


