### THE 'MORNING STARS' PLUS TWO

The Reformation, ignited by Martin Luther's nailing of his 95 *premises* to the door of the University Church in Wittenberg in 1517, was the *combustion of doctrinal*, *religious and nationalistic embers* smoldering for centuries. A central theme of the 'Morning Stars' Reformers was a desire to return to the Bible as the source of spiritual authority. Printing presses and new Bible translations fed

the flame that turned into the worldwide bonfire that we know as the Reformation.

JOHN HUS/ JAN HUS (CZECH 1369 — DIED 1415 GERMANY) 100 years before Luther wrote condemning indulgences and urging church reform, John Hus, a rector/preacher/priest/ philosopher/scholar from Prague in Eastern Europe openly espoused such doctrines. Under the promise of safe conduct. Hus traveled to Konstanz (Constance) Germany to sort out his conflicts with Rome. Once there, he was thrown in prison. Leaders of the papal Council decided they didn't have

to honor 'safe conduct,' since they concluded Hus was a *heretic*. In 1415, Hus was burned at the stake. 100 years later, Luther mindful of Hus' history refused to go to Rome when summoned by the Pope. Luther remained protected on German soil; and the flame of the Reformation was not snuffed out.

Hus' message was simple: Christ alone is head of the church. A pope through ignorance and love of money can make many mistakes, and that to rebel against an erring pope is to obey Christ. The message spread through Eastern Europe and was well received like Luther's 100 yrs later, because of a growing sense of national identity and freedom. The Czech nobility had come to resent what they

saw as the Church's interference in their affairs. Upon Hus' death, Czech nobles actively rebelled against Papal rule.

JOHN WYCLIFFE (ENGLISH 1320 — DIED 1384 ENGLAND) Hus was inspired by the work of Oxford University professor John Wycliffe, who preceded him by about 30 years. By 1384, Wycliffe dared to translate the Latin Bible into English (the vernacular, the informal language of the people) to encourage personal Bible reading. He taught that the Bible alone, and not Church authority was the only source of divine truth. English nobility were his patrons and protectors, warmly welcoming Wycliffe's teachings. Safe in England, Wycliffe avoided Hus' fate in his lifetime. However, in 1428, Catholic authorities sent a commission to dig up the heretic's bones and burn them and scatter the ashes in the river.

**DESIDERIUS ERASMUS** (DUTCH 1466 - DIED 1536 SWITZERLAND) Erasmus was a Catholic priest/ social critic/ teacher/ theologian and celebrated scholar who was the first to publish an edited version of the *Greek* New Testament in flowing Latin. The widespread ability to access Scripture in the original Greek exposed questionable doctrines that

the Catholic Church had used to support its extensive system of indulgences and priestly authority. He always remained Catholic and took a middle way in controversy.

WILLIAM TYNDALE (ENGLISH 1494 - DIED 1536 BELGIUM)
In 1522, Tyndale, an English priest and scholar, acquired a copy of Luther's translation of New Testament into German. Inspired, Tyndale began a translation into



Greek text compiled by Erasmus and Hebrew texts. His 'vernacular' translations were condemned. A price on his head, he fled to Germany printing his works there. Above is the Gospel of John verses 1:1-3. In 1536, Tyndale was

Turned over to the civil authorities, he was strangled to death and burned at the stake. His last words are said to have been, "Lord! Open the King of England's eyes." [The King was Henry the 8th. His prayer was answered.]


The goal is to strengthen the faith and spiritual disciplines and develop a closer relationship with God.




