## IHN Coming To CHPC

College Hill Presbyterian will be hosting 4 homeless families again during the week beginning July 10. As a matter of fact we will also be hosting in August, October and December, which is one week more than we have in previous years. Housing families like this provides a lot of opportunities to join together as a community in service.

Needs include:

- 1. Overnight Hosts** Each night of the week we provide at least one person to spend the night with our guests. This duty requires a person to come at 8pm and stay until the IHN bus comes around 6:30am. A bed in a semi-private room will be available for you to dream sweet dreams. Setting out a simple breakfast in the morning is part of the duty.
- 2. Food Supplies and Staples** Food supplies are needed for breakfast and lunch each day. Staples such as paper products and bathroom necessities are also needed. Stop by the table in the atrium to find out exactly what we need.
- 3. Kitchen Hosts** Each of the seven nights there is an opportunity to assist with kitchen duties like washing dishes and assisting with lunch preparation for the next day.
- 4. Room setup/tear-down** On Sunday July 10th after second service, assistance is needed to transform the classrooms into bedrooms for the IHN guests. On Sunday July 17th, before first service (~8am) there is also a need to put away the beds, cleanup and set up the classroom for Foundation Hour.
- 5. Dinner preparation** Sunday evening, July 10th, CHPC has the responsibility for meal preparation. Please leave your address and/or phone number at the atrium table if you are interested in dinner contributions.
- 6. Games and Activities** We are looking for a person(s), family or group that would like to help with activities on Sunday and Thursday evenings from 7-8pm.
- 7. Laundry** On Sunday July 17th, there will be pre-bundled bags of laundry that need to be done. Laundry can be washed and returned at your convenience.

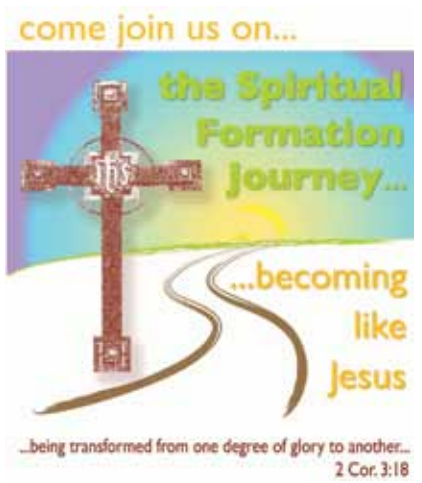
Together we can make an impact on the lives of many students as well as being a blessing for the schools.

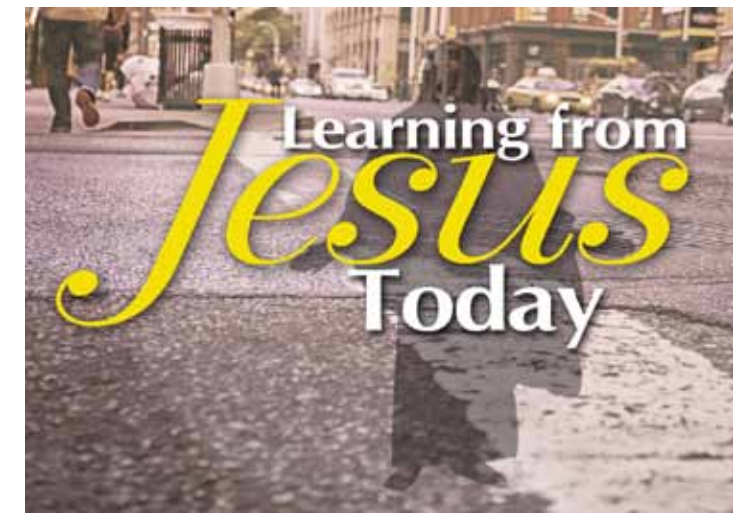
