

## World Renew Haiti Staff Assess Damage from Hurricane Matthew

### Help World Renew respond to Hurricane Matthew

On October 4, Hurricane Matthew battered the southwestern tip of Haiti as a Category 4 hurricane. The gigantic storm packed 145 mph (220 km) winds, dropped 20 to 40 inches of rain on the country, and blew 7- to 10-foot waves onto the western coast. World Renew is appealing for funds to respond to the destruction caused by Hurricane Matthew.



Staff and partners of World Renew were already present in Haiti on an ongoing basis and are preparing to respond to the flooding and destruction wreaked by Matthew today.

Haiti's southern peninsula took the brunt of the storm, with significant flooding and severe housing damage already being reported.

As the response to Matthew takes shape, financial support is urgently needed to provide assistance among Haiti's hardest hit communities.

## Mike LaRosa To Speak At Supper Club

### "WE WANT TO MAKE YOU SMILE!"

This is the phrase you'll see if you go to LaRosa's blog. The next sentence you'll read is, "It's why we come to work every day." We smile every time we eat LaRosa's pizza and you'll hear lots of "oohs" and "aahs" in between bites.

When Buddy LaRosa opened his first neighborhood pizzeria on the West Side over 60 years ago, his father told him he was crazy. "You gonna sell pizza? Medigans' (Americans) never gonna buy pizza from you," he said. Who would argue with him? After all, in 1954 many in the United States had never even heard of pizza. But Buddy continued his plan, and so began the story of LaRosa's Pizzerias. It is a bona fide, star spangled Great American Success Story.

Buddy scraped together \$400 and, with a couple of partners and his Aunt Dena's pizza recipe, opened "Papa Gino's" - the original pizzeria on Boudinot Avenue. It gained a fast following among high school kids and families from the growing western Cincinnati suburbs, who made the place a favorite meeting place. Within the first few years, Buddy's partner left the business and he renamed it LaRosa's. Over the years we have watched the company grow so that we can now enjoy LaRosa's in all of our neighborhoods and even at the Ball Park and Bengals games.

Come and hear the story first hand from Mike LaRosa (CEO of LaRosa's, Inc.) one of Buddy's sons. Mike keeps a journal. In a journal entry from 1984, Michael wrote, "Welcome every day with a smile. View today as a gift from God, filled with golden opportunities. Be a self-starter and let your first hour awake set the theme for a successful day with your positive mindset. Today will never happen again so make the most of it."




