ECO SYNOD MEETING

On Thursday, January 25, our denomination the Covenant Order of Evangelical Presbyterians (ECO) held our Third Biennial Synod Business meeting. This meeting happens every two years consisting of delegates from every church session who vote on national church concerns. Voting delegates to the Synod meeting from CHPC were Revs. Dennis Hall and Drew Smith, Janet Dumford and Barry Stare. The meeting demonstrated excellent debate and discussion. The delegates deliberated most of morning about the Confessional Standards of our denomination.

In ECO we have a three-level expression of our written documents. Of highest authority is the Bible, God's written word. The Essential Tenets, the second level, comprise our best summary of the most significant Christian doctrines. The Confessional Standards, the third level, serve as a historical support and teaching of Reformed Theology. As a six-year old denomination, we have not yet solidified our Confessional Standards and this Synod meeting has taken a huge step in clarifying them.

The Delegates have recommended the Apostle's Creed, the Nicene Creed, the Heidelberg Catechism, the Westminster Confession and Catechisms, and the Declaration of Barmen. Our former Book of Confessions in our previous denomination, the Presbyterian Church (USA), had 10 statements of faith but this recommendation has decreased that to six.

The Synod voted to ask the Theological Task Force, a group of pastors and elders elected by the Synod, to develop a resource that will help the whole church understand these historical statements of faith. In addition, the Task Force was asked to explore a process to engage the denomination to write a modern-day statement of faith that truly captures the mission and vision that God has called us to pursue.

The National Gathering also had two additional days of powerful speakers, workshops, praise and prayer. You will be hearing more about that in the months to come. Please continue to pray for our denomination to continue to pursue God's mission as a new movement of the church of Jesus Christ.



CARE & COUNSELING CORNER

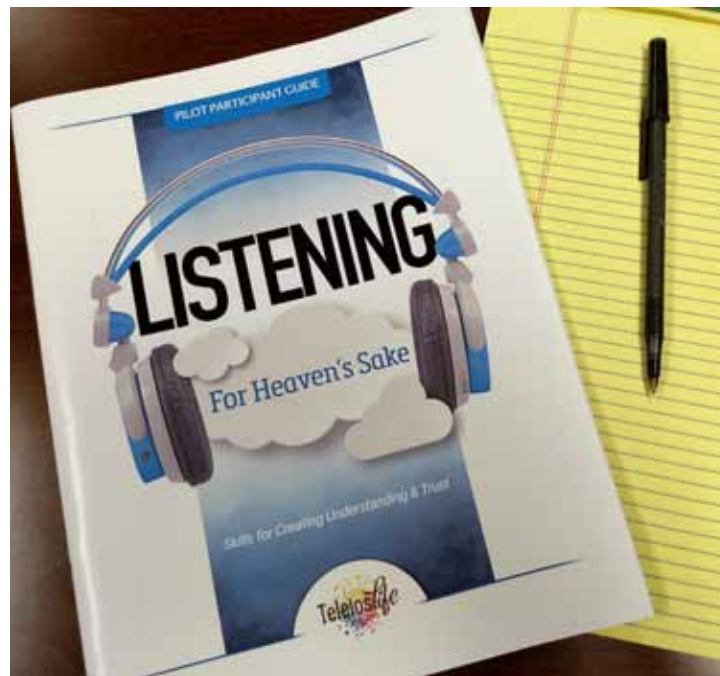
